First Reading Genesis 28:10-17 NIV

Jacob left Beersheba and set out for Harran. When he reached a certain place, he stopped for the night because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones there, he put it under his head and lay down to sleep. He had a dream in which he saw a stairway resting on the earth, with its top reaching to heaven, and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. There above it[a] stood the Lord, and he said: "I am the Lord, the God of your father Abraham and the God of Isaac. I will give you and your descendants the land on which you are lying. Your descendants will be like the dust of the earth, and you will spread out to the west and to the east, to the north and to the south. All peoples on earth will be blessed through you and your offspring.[b] I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go, and I will bring you back to this land. I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you."

When Jacob awoke from his sleep, he thought, "Surely the Lord is in this place, and I was not aware of it." He was afraid and said, "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God; this is the gate of heaven."

Second Reading Matthew 18.10-14 MSG

"Watch that you don't treat a single one of these childlike believers arrogantly. You realize, don't you, that their personal angels are constantly in touch with my Father in heaven?

"Look at it this way. If someone has a hundred sheep and one of them wanders off, doesn't he leave the ninety-nine and go after the one? And if he finds it, doesn't he make far more over it than over the ninety-nine who stay put? Your Father in heaven feels the same way. He doesn't want to lose even one of these simple believers.

Reflection

Like Jacob I simply want to lay my head down, on a pillow rather than a stone, to lay my head down and sleep hoping against hope that the world will look different when I awake. Like the lost sheep I need my angel shepherd to find me and lead me home. I had hoped that images of St Michael, sword in hand, battling the rebellious heavenly hoards - I had hoped that this image would inspire and uplift me. No such luck even the story of the mighty Archangel Michael fighting against the odds did not lift my spirits.

So I really don't know what to say to you or to myself today. Sometimes it is just too hard. I could try the prayer, if you can call it that, the prayer from the beginning of this pandemic of simply standing in the garden and shouting. But even that prayer requires energy and my mojo has deserted me.

If you feel like I do please know that you are not alone. Most of us just now are lost sheep, trying to sleep with stones for pillows. If you are more energised then please pray for the rest of us as we struggle to find our mojo once again. Find it we will I am sure of that because Jacob, even on his stone pillow, saw a vision which reenergised him. The lost sheep was found and returned to the safety of the fold. God is with us - our angels are with us sword in hand to protect and defend us. Amen
